

MARINA DEL REY

FACT SHEET

LOCATION

Situated in the heart of the Los Angeles coastline just four miles from LAX, Marina del Rey is the L.A. area's urban coastal destination with waterfront hotels, dining, and year-round water recreation and harbor cruises. The Marina is walking distance to the world-famous Venice Beach and a bike ride away from Santa Monica. Plus, Marina del Rey's proximity to major freeways puts visitors in easy reach of L.A.'s top attractions including Universal Studios Hollywood, Sofi Stadium, and Beverly Hills.



HISTORY

Prior to its dedication in 1965 as the largest man-made small-craft harbor in the United States, Marina del Rey was an estuary frequented by duck hunters and fishermen. A portion of the marsh at the Marina's southern border is now a preserve called the Ballona Wetlands. Between 1887 and the 1930s, various developers envisioned plans for the marshland, but it wasn't until 1954 that President Eisenhower green-lit a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers proposal to dredge the area and create a small-craft harbor. The Marina was dedicated on July 10, 1965, and the surrounding community became identified as Marina del Rey.



STRUCTURE

Marina del Rey is an unincorporated portion of Los Angeles County, which means it's technically not a city. The area is represented by L.A. County's second district and is overseen by the L.A. County Department of Beaches and Harbors. The Marina has nearly 5,000 boat slips and provides easy access to on-the-water recreation and waterfront hotels and restaurants.

WEATHER

Marina del Rey generally offers year-round sunshine and average annual temperatures in the mid to high 60s Fahrenheit. August is the warmest month, with temps usually in the low to mid 70s. December is the coldest month, with temps in the low 50s and mid 60s. Measurable precipitation is generally limited to January and February, with an average rainfall of three inches at that time.


HOTELS

Seven hotels representing approximately 1,400 guest rooms fall within the Marina boundary (west of Lincoln Boulevard, south of Washington Boulevard). All properties offer water views and are in walking distance of a waterfront promenade, Marina "Mother's" Beach, restaurants, and leisure activities. Hotels include: Courtyard by Marriott; Hilton Garden Inn; Jamaica Bay Inn; Marina del Rey Hotel; Marriott Marina Del Rey; Residence Inn by Marriott; and The Ritz-Carlton, Marina del Rey.



DINING

Marina del Rey is a burgeoning culinary scene in the heart of the desirable Los Angeles coast, boasting waterfront views, year-round outdoor dining, and award-winning restaurants. Food aficionados flock here for twists on a traditional fare, local hangouts, and celebrated fine dining with the picturesque harbor as a romantic backdrop. With more than 60 full-service restaurants in less than a two-mile radius, the Marina offers something for everyone, whether it's farm-to-table cuisine, a happening happy hour with budget bites, or a champagne brunch. Also, both dinner and brunch cruises are offered weekly year-round.



ACTIVITIES

Fitness lovers and outdoor enthusiasts enjoy the Marina's easy access to the ocean, making it L.A.'s leading recreational hub for on-the-water fun including sailing, kayak and jet ski rentals, paddle board yoga, sportfishing, parasailing, whale watching, and more. Visitors who'd rather stay ashore can tackle the 22-mile Marvin Braude Coastal Bike Path, stroll the waterfront Burton Chace Park, or enjoy some sun at Marina "Mother's" Beach, which has volleyball nets, a picnic pavilion, and a playground.

BOATING

The Marina is the largest man-made small-craft harbor in North America. It is home to over 4,600 boat slips. Visitors wanting to get out on the water have many options, from small watercraft rentals to skippered charters. The Marina del Rey Tourism Board maintains a list of properly licensed and insured charter companies that have been vetted through the L.A. County Department of Beaches and Harbors. Go to visitmdr.com/charters for a current list. Additionally, City Cruises offers weekly dining cruises in the calm harbor year-round.



EVENTS

Marina del Rey offers free, fun activities throughout the year. Annual traditions like the Fourth of July Fireworks, Summer Concert Series, and Holiday Boat Parade draw huge crowds. Smaller gatherings such as the summer Beach Eats food trucks, the California Yacht Club's Sunset Series Regattas, the Marina del Rey Farmers Market, and weekend concerts at Fisherman's Village are popular with locals. Many also choose the Marina for corporate events, weddings, and other special occasions.



ABOUT THE TOURISM BOARD

The Marina del Rey Tourism Board is the official destination marketing organization that promotes leisure and business travel for Marina del Rey. Located along the Los Angeles coastline and only four miles from LAX, Marina del Rey is the largest man-made small-craft harbor in North America.
